- Although telephonic Council Meetings are not allowed, will be looking at alternative ways to communicate with the Council
- Will be reviewing how to handle any sick leave associated with the virus; Stafford Act is now in place

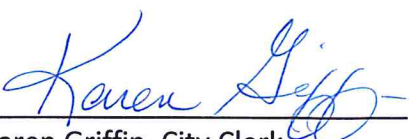
COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS – Council
