

RESOLUTION 24

WHEREAS, at a special meeting of the Councilmen of the City of Parker, Florida, on February 25, 1972, the Councilmen discussed the subject of a revision of Article V of the Florida Constitution to be voted on by the public on March 14, 1972, and

WHEREAS, there was read a Resolution from the Florida League of Cities in opposition to the adoption of the revision to Article V, designed to abolish municipal courts, and the Councilmen having found the reasons in opposition thereto well-founded and in the interest of City government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Councilmen of the City of Parker, Florida, that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to give notice to the Florida League of Cities and such other state officials as might be deemed appropriate to express opposition of the City of Parker, Florida, of the adoption of the revision of Article V of the Florida Constitution, to be voted on by the public of the State of Florida on March 14, 1972.
