

RESOLUTION NO. 65

WHEREAS, The City of Parker has noted that the Federal Register dated March 30, 1978, contained a Notice of Proposed Rule Making, which announced the intention of the Social Security Administration to require the State Agency to pay social security taxes fifteen (15) days after the end of each month, beginning January 1980, and

WHEREAS, the State would require local government to pay their social security taxes some time between the first and fifteenth of the month, and


WHEREAS, we, the City of Parker, strongly oppose this proposal for the following reasons:


- (a) It would increase administrative costs of the program at both the State and Local Government level
- (b) Provide insufficient time to balance payrolls and reconcile differences
- (c) Time frame is inadequate which will cause errors and could penalize individual employees

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Parker, Florida, that by unanimous vote, we oppose the Proposed Rule Making to pay social security taxes fifteen (15) days after the end of each month beginning January, 1980.
