

RESOLUTION NO. 108

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING PROCESS

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City of Parker that the public participate in the comprehensive planning process to the fullest extent possible; and

WHEREAS, the City of Parker wishes to comply with all the provisions of the Florida Statutes and Florida Administrative Code governing public participation in adoption of and amendment to the Comprehensive Plan.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF PARKER:

1. The City of Parker shall provide notice to owners of real property located in the City of Parker and to the general public on its adoption of and amendment to the Comprehensive Planning as follows:

A. The City of Parker shall advertise in the Panama City News-Herald all major activities relating to the development, implementation and amendment of the Comprehensive Plan in accordance with Sections 163.3184 and 163.3187 of the Florida Statutes.

B. The City of Parker shall between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. (local time) on Monday through Friday, excluding holidays, make available for review by the general public a copy of draft and final Comprehensive Plan documents.

2. The City of Parker shall insure that the public is provided with adequate opportunities to be heard as follows:

A. Requests for written comments shall be a part of the public notices pertaining to the Comprehensive Plan.

B. Public hearings as required by Sections 163.3184 and 163.3187 of the Florida Statutes shall be conducted by the City of Parker.

C. The City of Parker shall respond to all written comments in writing within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt. Oral comments at public hearings shall be addressed when appropriate.
