

RESOLUTION RELATING TO GRANT FUNDS FROM THE
FLORIDA RECREATIONAL DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE
PROGRAM AND THE LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION
FUND PROGRAM

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF PARKER:

1. This Resolution is being adopted as part of the application process for the City of Parker to obtain matching funds from the Florida Recreational Development Assistance Program ("FRDAP") and from the Land and Water Conservation Fund ("LWCF").
2. The City of Parker is requesting One Hundred and Fifty Thousand and No/100 (\$150,000.00) in grant funds from the LWCF and the FRDAP for the acquisition of certain property to become a part of the Parker Athletic Field project. The project has a total acquisition project cost of Three Hundred and Seventy-Eight Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$378,000.00). The source of match will be the general fund revenue of the City of Parker or other state or local funds which may become available to the City of Parker.
3. The City of Parker hereby authorizes the submission of the grant application and any other documentation or information in connection with the grant application or grant award. The City of Parker further authorizes the City Clerk to act as the official liaison in the grant process. The City of Parker also designates the Mayor as the official to sign all documents executed in connection with the application and funding of the grant requested.
4. The City of Parker certifies that:
 - (a) It has an officially adopted local Comprehensive Plan, adopted in 1980, which includes a Recreation and Open-Space Element. There is no Marina Element required nor contained in the current Comprehensive Plan.
 - (b) An ongoing program of public participation encouraging involvement by all segments of the population within the City of Parker, including minority and disadvantaged citizens in the planning for and selection of recreation projects, was adopted in Resolution No. 114. Further, the Parker Athletic Advisory Board was created to facilitate the involvement of all

segments of the population in the planning for and selection of recreation projects.

(c) It has available sufficient funds in its general fund revenue greater than the program matching cash and this match will remain available until needed.

(d) It is in a fiscally and legally responsible position to satisfactorily acquire and eventually to develop and maintain the entire Parker Athletic Field project site in accordance with the program requirements.
