Mayor Barrow called the meeting to order. Council member Oost gave the prayer and led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Roll Call

Mayor Barrow and Council Members Miller, Nepereny, Oost, and Spikes were present.

Items from Audience

Kathleen O'Brien-Reichelt stated that she would like for the minutes on the City's website to be updated. The City Clerk stated that she would update them tomorrow but due to the space of the website she would have to delete some of the old ones first.

Mayor Barrow stated that there was a collapse at P-14 and that Cliff Wilson of Preble Rish and the City's Public Works Supervisor would like to update the Council on the issue. Mr. Wilson stated that the gravity main on P-14 was in bad shape and that GAC came out to the site and they would be using camera crews tomorrow to look at the gravity main and setting well points. Mr. Wilson then stated that Insituform would be coming tomorrow at 3:00pm for a meeting instead of next week. Council Member Nepereny asked if they would be using trench boxes and Mr. Wilson stated yes. Council Member Nepereny also asked if the manhole affiliated with the lift station was on the list and Mr. Wilson stated that it was not. He then stated that the manhole list was done in 2006 and has not been re-updated since then. Mr. Wilson stated that it has cost approximately \$9,500.00 for the first repair and around \$4,000.00 to \$5,000.00 for the second one. He then stated it would be around \$3,500.00 to \$4,500.00 to be lined. The Council agreed by consensus that it needed to be done since it is an emergency. Mr. Brunson stated that he would like for the Council and the Citizens to know that the city lines are in bad shape and they could possibly be worse than expected. Mr. Brunson also stated that GAC and Preble Rish were doing an outstanding job.

Mayor Barrow presented the proclamation to the Parker Fire Department.

Resolution 2011-292 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARKER, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF THE WASTEWATER FACILITIES PLAN AND THE CAPITAL FINANCE PLAN FOR THE RECOMMENDED EXISTING WASTEWATER FACILITIES.

Elizabeth Moore with Preble Rish stated that she needed to talk about the SRF loan before the Council reads and adopts the resolution. Ms. Moore stated that as part of the SRF planning requirements, the City must hold a public meeting to discuss the Wastewater Facilities Plan and the financial impact on wastewater users. The purpose of tonight's meeting is to give a brief overview of the Wastewater Facility Plan and the costs associated with the proposed project improvements so that the City can move forward with adopting the Wastewater Facilities Plan and Capital Facilities Plan.

The purpose of the Wastewater Facilities Plan is to document the project need, develop alternatives, select the best alternative, evaluate environmental effects, provide financial planning, and outline the project schedule.

The Wastewater Facilities Plans considers three alternatives for the proposed water distribution system improvement project.

- The first alternative includes rehabilitation improvements of existing wastewater facility components that are in poor condition due to deterioration over time. Cost estimated at \$356,905.
- The second alternative includes the rehabilitation of existing facilities that are in poor condition and pump station upgrades required accommodate the increased flows from the Long Point Cove development and meet current capacity requirements. Cost estimated at \$2,058,913.
- The third alternative involves the rehabilitation of existing facilities that are in poor condition and pump station upgrades required to meet current and future capacity requirements. These pumps stations upgrades will accommodate

additional flows from the Long Point Cove development and other undeveloped areas throughout the City. Cost estimated at \$3,484,245.

The selected plan involves wastewater upgrades to meet existing condition needs and the rehabilitation of existing wastewater facilities that are in poor condition. The proposed wastewater collection system improvements will include the rehabilitation of 4,200 Lf of existing gravity mains and 30 manholes. The proposed wastewater transmission system improvements include the rehabilitation of pump station P-14 wet well and the replacement of discharge piping in pump station P-17. These proposed improvements will prevent further deterioration of existing wastewater system facilities that are in poor condition. The proposed wastewater transmission and collection system improvements will all occur within the existing City of Parker service area

No negative environmental impacts are anticipated as part of this project. All improvements are located within existing right-of-ways and utility easements. The short term impacts may include noise during construction and minimal soil disturbances. Stormwater erosion control devices will be used to prevent runoff and erosion at the construction sites. The long-term impacts of the project are beneficial. These benefits include providing adequate uninterrupted wastewater service and prevent wastewater failure incidents.

The total project cost of the proposed wastewater system improvements is estimated at \$356,905, including construction, planning, administration, engineering and other technical service cost. The proposed improvements will not affect the wastewater system's operation and maintenance cost (O & M). The anticipated annual debt service for the proposed project capital cost is \$17,835, assuming a 35% SRF Grant and 65% SRF Loan at 3.00% interest rate for a 20 year term. Pledged revenues for debt payments are the City's monthly water and wastewater income. Utility rate increases will not be required to provide additional revenues for the proposed project.

Council Member Oost made a motion seconded by Council Member Spikes to read resolution 2011-292. Upon taking the yeas and nays the vote was Yeas 5, Nays 0. Motion carried. Mr. Sloan read the resolution.

Council Member Oost made a motion seconded by Council Member Nepereny to adopt the resolution with the changes. Upon taking the yeas and nays the vote was Yeas 5, Nays 0. Motion carried.

After some discussion Council Member Nepereny made a motion seconded by Council Member Spikes to write an RFP. Upon taking the yeas and nays the vote was Yeas 3, Nays 2. Council Member Miller and Council Member Oost voting nay. Motion carried.

Discussion of Insurance

Donna Nelms-Robinson addressed the Council and stated that she used to be the City's agent of record for Blue Cross Blue Shield of Florida for eight years and she would like to ask to City to reappoint her. Gerald Stanford of Stanford Insurance stated that he was the city's agent of record as well as the city's insurance consultant. Mr. Stanford then stated he has been in business for 35 years and that he insures every city in Bay County. Mr. Stanford asked Ms. Nelms-Robinson how many cities did she insure and she stated none. Mayor Barrow stated that she felt the city should go out for bids for insurance. Mr. Stanford stated that since he was the city's consultant all bids would have to go to him before they were brought to the city. Mayor Barrow stated that she did not want that. She stated that maybe the city should consider not having Mr. Stanford as their consultant since the city had never had one before. After some discussion the council agreed by consensus to table the item until a later date.

Write off of the trash truck

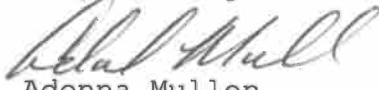
