

DIRECT HOUSING

STEPS FOR HOMEOWNERS AND RENTERS

- 1 Register at [DisasterAssistance.gov](https://www.disasterassistance.gov)** or visit a Disaster Recovery Center or call 800-621-3362 (TTY: 800-462-7585).
- 2 An inspector will schedule a visit** to assess your damaged home.
- 3** If eligible for the program, **FEMA will contact you** for an interview and to discuss your permanent housing plan.

IF YOU HAVE INSURANCE, file a claim immediately and submit your insurance settlement information to FEMA.

4 IF YOU ARE A HOMEOWNER:

A site inspection will determine if a unit can be placed on your private property.

If your site is approved, FEMA will install a unit on your property.

If your site is not approved, FEMA will install a unit at a commercial location.

IF YOU ARE A RENTER:

A unit may be placed **in a commercial park.**

If your landlord agrees and the site is feasible, a unit may be placed **on their property.**

- 5** You need to **contact your utility company** to connect water and power to your unit.
- 6** After your unit is installed, **FEMA will conduct a final inspection.**
- 7 Sign a license-in-agreement.** For continued federal assistance, you must show that you are working towards your permanent housing plan.
