Two budgets were discussed previously by council, one included wish list items from the departments and council agreed that those are going to be put into a 5- and 10-year plan. Mayor Kelly stated he found a \$50,000 ladder truck and would like approval to purchase it for fire protection of the new taller construction of apartments. Discussion that a crew is here from GCU now working on a project and they could replace 50 manholes without having to incur the cost of mobilization, the job could be done for approximately \$125,000. Asked to add the firetruck and manhole discussion to the agenda for next Thursday, August 25th at 9 am.

Discussion about where revenues will need to come from in the future, water revenues cannot sustain the city, too much infrastructure is needed in the utility system.
