HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

Share these handy tips to keep your little ghosts and goblins safe this Halloween!



1. Children should always be accompanied by an adult

5. Always look both ways before crossing the street

6. Unknown animals may be dangerous and should not be approached

10. For extra visibility, attach reflective tape to your child's costume
