ITEMS FROM THE AUDIENCE

• Jake Mearhead 4819/4821 South Lakewood drive

It was recommended by Ms. Hinrichs that Mr. Mearhead attend the planning commission meeting to request a variance for lots related to height of development relevant to the road due to slope of the land.

Chairman Rega recommends that Mr. Mearhead have an engineer look at his plans as the location he is inquiring about is a watershed area. It was recommended that Mr. Mearhead provide drawings related to the development for further discussion.

Attorney Sloan advised the council had previously enacted updates to the floodplains ordinance provisions that cannot be waived.

Mr. Mearhead stated that he was not in a floodplain.

Mr. Robicheaux made suggestions as to home construction on piers for Mr. Mearhead.

- Rich Whitaker requesting provision to build on his property with a 3 versus 5-foot setback.
- Pat Fousek 1344 Stratford Avenue

Ms. Fousek had questions regarding the building or developer order process and steps.

Ms. Fousek requested information on ongoing major projects that had been previously approved by the planning commission and those that are ongoing in the planning process.

Ms. Fousek inquired about gaining information regarding future projects that would reflect positively for Parker.

• Eddie Ray Eans

He is interested in opening a restaurant/bar. He is concerned with zoning compliance in MU2. The commission stated that there are no concerns about restaurant/bar development in MU2 so long as they comply with current LDR standards.

Chairman Rega related the rules regarding the LDR's exclusion of accessory dwelling structures.

Mr. Lynn was advised of setbacks and easement requirements.

Mr. Lynn voluntarily withdraws request for a variance for project B

2. Discussion of LDR amendment to allow limited light manufacturing in certain land use districts - Committee

Chairman Rega asked that a discussion occur regarding ideas from the commission occur.

Chairman Rega suggested that a level of specificity regarding obnoxious odors be added.

Chairman Rega additionally asked that temperature requirements be addressed.

Mr. Stryker asked about the "word" manufacturing existing in the LDR.

A discussion occurred as to the location of the word and possible adjustments to its application within the LDR.

Chairman Rega questioned the use of the phrase "assembly plant" in the LDR.

Attorney Sloan suggested that this be reviewed under prohibited uses.

Mr. Robicheaux asked that this agenda item be moved forward to the next meeting on August 8, 2023.
