Situation Overview

Another round of potentially significant severe weather across the region on Friday.

- Coverage of severe storms expected to be more scattered; greater uncertainty in timing.
- Potential of a few storms containing significant severe hazards.

All severe hazards possible:

- Damaging thunderstorm wind gusts of 60 mph. Some storms potentially containing 70 mph destructive gusts.
- Several tornadoes (a few could possibly be strong; EF2 or higher)
- Hail, with some large hail (greater than 2") possible.

Other Hazards:

- Non-thunderstorm sustained winds 20 to 30 mph (highest across GA/AL).
- Occasional non-thunderstorm gusts of 35 to 50 mph beginning mid Friday morning.
- Increased winds/seas with elevated surf heights and possible beach erosion.


mpacts:

Scattered power outages, especially in areas with weakened trees from Tuesday's Severe Event.





Severe Weather Outlook Friday



What:

- Scattered severe storms across the area.
- Enhanced Risk (level 3 of 5) indicates greatest risk for impacts. Details further refined tomorrow.

When:

Some threats pre-dawn Friday, but primary threat Friday afternoon. Timing more uncertain with this event.

•Hazards:

- 60 mph thunderstorm wind gusts, several tornadoes, and hail.
- Some storms could be strong containing:
 - 70 mph gusts, strong tornadoes, hail > 2 inches




Higher Threat for Severe Storms





Severe Weather Outlook Friday



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






Forecast Rainfall Amounts

These amounts will largely not cause issues with flooding across the area.






Non-Thunderstorm Sustained Winds and Gusts
